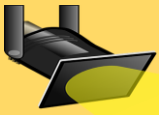

# MEMBER SPOTLIGHT



## Jennie Cole

My name is Jenny Davis Cole and I grew up in Northridge and Santa Clarita. I played in the Southern California Junior Golf Association in Los Angeles for 11 years where I won over 100 junior tournaments. I won the International Pee Wee Golf Tournament in Florida and finished 4th at the Junior World Championships at Mission Bay GC when I was 12. Since there wasn't a girls' golf team at my high school, Wm. S. Hart High, I played on the boys' varsity golf team at Valencia CC. I won most of my matches and many boys resented me because of it. I received a full golf scholarship to UCLA, alternating between one and two positions, was team captain and MVP in 1978 and 1979, an All American, and an 8-time college tournament winner. At UCLA, we were privileged to play a great private golf course every day like Riviera CC, Bel Air CC, Brentwood CC, Hillcrest CC, El Caballero CC, Lakeside CC, and Los Angeles CC. Our assistant golf coach, LPGA star Amy Alcott, helped our team finish in the top 5 in Nationals my last two years. On a side note, I was thrilled to play in our golf fundraiser events with Bob Hope, Efrem Zimbalist, Clint Eastwood, George C Scott, Claude Akins, and Dean Martin.

I played in three USGA Women's Amateur Tournaments (1979, 1980, and 1981) and my best finish was quarterfinalist in 1980 at Prairie Dunes CC in Hutchinson, Kansas losing 1 up to Juli Simpson Inkster, who ended up being the champion. That automatically qualified me for the 1981 U.S. Women's Open at La Grange CC in Illinois where I played with LPGA greats Beth Daniel and Hollis Stacy, finishing third low amateur. I played in three LPGA events as an amateur in 1979 and 1980 at the Sunstar Classic at Rancho Park GC and in 1981 at the Olympia Gold Classic at Industry Hills GC, and made the cut in all of them. I was the junior and women's club champions at Porter Valley CC and I won the WSCGA Champion of Champions tournament in 1982.

After amateur golf, I decided to turn pro. I worked at a local golf club giving lessons, and unfortunately failed two times trying to obtain my LPGA card. This was discouraging, so in 1983, I accepted a computer programmer analyst job at General Dynamics which brought me to San Diego. In 1984, I got married and two years later, I decided I wanted to give it one last shot to play professional golf. I was fortunate to have my husband, Earl, caddy for me on two mini-tours: the Futures Tour and the WPGT tour from 1986-1989 winning 6 tournaments. The highlight for me is when I shot a 66 with 7 birdies in a tournament. Once I broke 70, I had several more rounds in the 60's. I was invited to compete on the Mizuno Japan Tour twice and won several pro-am tournaments. I also made the cut at the Konica Cup in Tokyo and played with Japan's famous LPGA star, Ayako Okamoto. Finally, I went to my last LPGA qualifying school and just missed getting my card at the final stage of the Q-school in 1988.

Soon after, I knew I wanted to start a family and golf had to take a back seat. I gave up my professional ambitions and had four children who all play golf. I was a teaching professional at the Vineyard GC from 1993-1995 and decided it was time to get my amateur status back so I could play locally. I played in the 2000 U.S Women's Mid-Amateur tournament at Big Canyon CC and joined Escondido CC where I won the club championship four times, played WSCGA team play, and won the WSCGA Champion of Champions again in 2001. I also played team play for San Luis Rey Downs GC.

When my daughter started San Pasqual High School there wasn't a girls' golf team so I started one and coached the girls' team for 10 years where we won 5 league championships. I also coached the boys' team where I was the only female coach in San Diego County. I was fortunate to coach my three daughters, one son, and current LPGA player, Haley Moore. I also coached the boys' varsity team at Escondido Charter High School, coached the Fellowship of Christian Athletes summer camps, and was the assistant coach for 4 years for the men's and women's golf teams at Cal State University, San Marcos where I also got to coach my daughter again.

I'm currently a member in the women's clubs at St. Mark GC and at the Vineyard GC and enjoy playing Santa Margarita and SDCWGA team play for both clubs. I was fortunate to win the St. Mark Women's Club Championship in May. When I am not playing golf, I care for my parents and have a homestay business placing international college students with local host families.

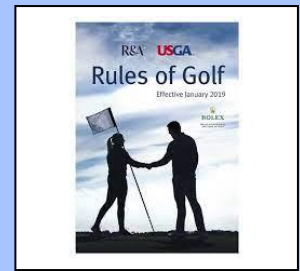

# Congratulations to the Champs!

## RULES CORNER July 2022



### RELIEF FOR BALL IN A **RED** PENALTY AREA

This month we will cover how to take relief from a **Red** Penalty Area. Rule 17.1d

If a player's ball is known or virtually certain to be in a Red Penalty Area the player again has the previously discussed (May 2022) options for relief:

1) Stroke-and-Distance Relief  
(a player may always play again from the original spot)

2) Back-on-the-Line-Relief

3) Lateral Relief

- a. The reference point is again the estimated point where the ball crossed the margin of the Penalty Area
- b. But the size of the Relief point is now two club-lengths.

**DIAGRAM #2 17.1d: RELIEF FOR BALL IN RED PENALTY AREA**

**X** Point that ball entered the penalty area  
**●** Reference points  
**○** Relief area

When it is known or virtually certain that a ball is in a red penalty area and the player wishes to take relief, the player has **three options**, each for one penalty stroke:

- (1) The player may take stroke-and-distance relief (see point (1) in Diagram #1 17.1d).
- (2) The player may take back-on-the-line relief (see point (2) in Diagram #1 17.1d).
- (3) The player may take lateral relief (red penalty area only). The reference point for taking lateral relief is point X.

Reference Point	Size of Relief Area	Limits on Relief Area
The estimated point where the original ball last crossed the edge of the red penalty area (point X)	Two club-lengths from the reference point 	The relief area: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Must not be nearer the hole than the reference point, and</li> <li>• May be in any area of the course except the same penalty area</li> </ul>
